# Short Fiction II: Unit 4 (approx. 9 days)

### **Instructional Purpose:**

- *Character*: Protagonist, antagonist, contrasts and conflicts among characters, how language reveals character, and how development of character relates to overall themes and ideas.
- *Setting*: How language helps establish atmosphere and mood of a setting, how environment reveals character.
- Structure: Plot patterns, archetypes, and contrasts and how they reveal conflicts in values or ideas.
- *Perspective*: Tone, how language choice reveals tone, comparing perspectives or various characters or narrators, and types of narration, including stream of consciousness.
- Writing: Planning and composing a close analysis of fiction.
